Whereas, it appears from a statement furnished by the County Treasurer that there is now in the Special O. C. R. Fund the sum of \$67.33; that all claims filed against the same have been paid or provided for, it was ordered by the Board that said amount of \$67.33 and all other moneys that may in the future come into said Special Fund be transferred to the Ordinary County Revenue Fund of the year 1915 and prior years.

Whereas, The Board of County Commissioners have made careful and conservative estimate of the amount of money required to be raised by taxation to meet and defray the ordinary county expenses of said county for the ensuing year, including the support of the poor and unforseen contingent expenses, and have figured each item of such expenditures at the lowest amount consistent with the probable expenditures respectively chargeable to in that connection, and find it will be necessary in order to defray said expenses to raise by taxation the sum of \$35,311.00.

Whereas, through inadvertence, there was omitted from the Resolution of this Board, adopted November 6th, 1917, levying the taxes for the year 1917 for State, County, school and other purposss, a levy for the payment of interest on the bonds of School District No. 2, in the County of Montezuma and State of Colorado: and Whereas it appears that a levy of one half mill on the dollar of the taxable property in said School District in said year 1917 will be necessary to meet the payment of said interest.

Resolved that there be and is hereby levied a tax in the amount of one half mill upon the property in School District No. 2 in the County of Montezuma and State of Colorado. subject to taxation for the year 1917 to pay the interest upon the Bonds of said School District accruing in the year 1918.

The Clerk was directed to notify H. S. Jobes and John Schaaf to clear the road right of way for that certain road intlownship: 39 N. R. 17 W. N. M. P. M., petitioned for by themselves and others.

It was ordered by the Board that a warrant be issued on the Road fund of the County in favor of John Lill for \$200.00 on account of his contract for the construction of what is known as the Stapleton Section of State Righway No. 45; said warrant to be delivered to said Lill upon his filing with the Clerk an affidavit that all claims for labor and material in connection with said work to December 1st, 1917, have been paid.

M. W. Tozer appeared before the Board protesting against the raise in his assessment on cattle for the year 1917; and he having made affidavit in support of such protest, and the Board upon due investigation of the matter finding that said raise was and is erroneous, it was ordered by the Board that said assessment stand as made by the County Assessor.

The Clerk was directed to advertise for sealed bids for Stationery Proposals, supplies and County printing for the year 1918. Said bids to be received up to 2:00 o'clock p. m., January 7th, 1918. The Board reserving the right to reject any or all bids.

George J. Ashbaugh appeared before the Board and made claim for compensation for rightof-way for County Road, same being part of State Primary Road Number 14, upon and accross
the North half of the South-east quarter of Section 29, and the North-west quarter of
the South-west quarter of Section 28, all in Township 36 N. R. 15 W. N. M. P. M., as
located and constructed accross said tract, and offered to convey to the County a strip
of said tract 30 feet on each side of the center line of said road as so located and
constructed, for the consideration of \$300.00 peand the Board deeming it for the best
interests of the County to accept said proposition, it was ordered by the Board that
the same be accepted, and that upon execution and delivery of a deed of conveyance in
that behalf, a warrant be issued upon the Road Fund of the County in favor of said
George J. Ashbaugh in payment of said consideration.

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McGrew Porter presented to the Board an offer to purchase Tax Sale Certificate No. 4379, covering the taxes for the year 1913 assessed against the South fifty (50) acres of the N. E. † (less 3 acres) of Section 21, Township 37 N. R. 16 W. N. M. P.M. flat assessed in the name of McG. Porter, and to pay therefor the amount of County, State and School taxes, and the Montezuma Valley Irrigation District General Fund tax with interest at 6%, and the Irrigation District Interest Fund tax with interest at 8%, and to pay all subsequent taxes in full on said property, together with the necessary certificate fees, if said offer be accepted.

Upon due consideration of said offer the Board deeming the acceptance of the same for the best interests of the County and The Montezuma Valley Irrigation District, it by the Board was ordered that eaid certificate be assigned to said applicant upon the payment of the flat amount of County, State and School taxes, and the Irrigation District General Fund tax with interest at 6%, and the Irrigation District Interest Fund tax with interest at 8%, together with all subsequent taxes and necessary certificate fees, as offered; approvided that such payments be made to the County Treasurer within thirty days from this date.

The following application of S. J. Smith to purchase tax sale certificates was presented to the Board:

"The undersigned, you patitioner, respectfully represents unto your Honorable Board as follows:

That the North-west quarter of Section 32, in Township 36 North, Range 15 West of the New Mexico Meridian, in Montezuma County, Colorado, was in the years 1910, 1911 and 1912, assessed, one half interest in the name of petitioner and one half in the name of Mary E. Kunter: That at the sale of lands for unpaid taxes held on December 15, 1913, the Munter interest was sold for the years 1911 and 1912, and the interest of petitioner sold for taxes for the years 1910, 1911 and 1912: and that tax sale vertificates of purchase were issued for all five sales in the name of Monteuma County: that said sales have not been redeemed and are still held by Montezuma County: also, that all taxes subsequently assessed against said land have not been paid.

Your petitioner offers to pay for the assignment to him of all said tax sale certificates the sum of One Dollar for each of said certificates, and at the time said assignment is made, to pay all of said taxes subsequently assessed against said land, with interest to date.

The Board after due consideration of said offer, deeming the acceptance of the same for the best interests of the County, it was ordered by the Board that said tax sale vertificates be assigned to said applicant upon the payment of One Dollar for each certificate, and of all subsequent taxes on said property to date, including all necessary certificate fees. Provided, however, that such payments be tendered the County Treasurer within 30 days from this date.

H. Brigham, Jr. and S. J. Smith presented to the Board an application to purchase Tax Sale Certificates 2766, 2813 and 2920 covering the 1910, 1911 and 1912 taxes assessed against the North-east quarter of Section 32, in Township 36 N. R. 15 W. N. M. P. M. in the name of Brigham and Smith, and agreeing to pay therefor the sum of One Dollar for each certificate, and to pay also, all subsequent taxes on said propertyincluding interest to date.

same for the best interests of the County, it was ordered by the Board that said tax sal certificates be sold to said applicant for the sum of One Dollar each, provided, however that they pay at the time of the assignment of said certificates to them by the County, all subsequent taxes assessed against said property, including interest and penalties to date, together with necessary certificate fees. And provided further, that such payments be made within 30 days from this date.

The matter of the petition of Arthur Reeder and others for a road in Township 39 and 38 N. R. 17 W. N. M. P. M., now coming on for consideration of the Board: and the Board, upon consideration of said petition, finding that the same is in due form of law; that the same is signed by all owners of lands through which said proposed road passes, and by the required number of free holders residing within two miles of the road sought to be laid out, and that no objections to the opening of the same has been filed as provided by law, it is ordered by the Board that said petition be granted and said road bs opened to travel.

The matter of the petition of Ben L. Wilson and others for a road in Township 38 N. R. 18 W. N. M. P. M., now coming on for consideration of the Board: and the Board upon due consideration of said petition, finding that the same is in due form of law: that the same is signed by all owners of lands through which said proposed road passes, and by the required number of free holders reciding within two miles of the road sought to be laid out: that no objection to the opening of said road has been filed as provided by law, it was ordered by the Board that eaid petition be granted and said road be opened to travel.
