FOURTH - That your County is to furnish all equipment for maintenance of State Highways in your county, without charge to The State Highway Department. The cost of any additional equipment required for proper maintenance, of said State Highways, shall come from county funds other than the amount appropriated by your Board to meet the amount awarded your county, by the State Highway Department. In other words, equipment cannot be charged to this joint State and County Maintenance fund.

FIFTH - That your Board shall furnish all labor, supplies, material and repairs to equipment, used in properly maintaining State Highways in your county and all such items charged to the joint State and County maintenance fund.

SINTH - That all maintenence work on State Highways in your county, shall be subject to the supervision and suggestions of the maintenence representative of the State Highway Department.

NINTH- That the number of months during the year 1926 that these patrol crews shall work and the number, size and character of said patrol crews to be regularly employed, as well as the maintenence work to be done on all State Highways in your county, shall be such as shall be mutually agreed to by your Board or representative and the maintenence representative of the State Highway Department.

TENTH - All disagreements or disputes between the Board of County Commissioners and the Maintenance representative of the Highway Department shall be referred by the Superintendent of Maintenance of the State Highway Department, to The State Mighway Engineer, for settlement and his decision shall be final.
