*Be it Resolved, That an agreement and lease to the County of Montezuma, bearing date of the 8th day of May, A. D. 1928, to use the premises of The Ric Grande Southern Railroad Company, near King's, in Montezuma County, Colorado, for public trabel, in form as just read to the Board of County Commissioners of Montezuma County, be entered into by the County of Montezuma, and the Board of County Commissioners is hereby authorized to execute said agreement on behalf of said County, and the County Clerk is hereby authorized to attest the same and affix the seal of the County thereto.

An order was passed by the Board discontinuing the allowance for poor relief made to Mrs. Etta Maness, and the Clerk instructed to so notify Mrs. Maness; also the P. T. Guillet Mercantile Co.
