

Regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners Montezuma County held Monday, ~~March~~ ^{March} 4th, at 10 o'clock A. M.

Motion by Mr. Porter that Mr. Englehart continue as Chairman of the Board. Seconded by Mr. Menefee and carried.

Minutes of meeting of December 7th, 1931 read and approved.

The road petition of C. A. Johnson, C. H. Rudy and others asking for a mile of road running north thru section two, township 34 N. of Range 17 W. N.E.1.M. was considered, and the Board finding same to be in accordance with law, same was approved and ordered opened.

Mrs. Elsie Archer appearing before the Board and making request for temporary aid, same was granted in the amount of \$7.50.

Mr. F. T. Henry, Deputy District Attorney presented to the Board the matter of whether or not the Board wishes him to prosecute a certain short-check maker who is now in Oklahoma. The Board instructed him not to proceed with the cases, upon motion duly made and seconded.

The Poor Relief petition of Mrs. Sylvia Spencer of Mancos was considered, and it was ordered that she be allowed \$15.00 per month until further orders of the Board.

Poor relief previously granted to Mrs. Clara J. Copeland of Cortez was reduced to \$12.50 per month, until further of the Board.

Mrs. D. Honaker appeared before the Board and paid 1931 rent on Poor Farm in full.

Mr. C. A. Allen of the State Agricultural College and many taxpayers of Montezuma County met with the Board in the interests of the County Extension work, asking that same be carried on in Montezuma County for 1932. No further action taken by the Board.

It having been brought to the attention of the Board that the County Treasurer now has in his possession the amount of \$ Forest Service fees, it is hereby ordered by the Board that same to credited to county funds as follows:

60%	to the credit of the Road Fund
40%	" " " " " School Fund

The matter of the county printing for the following year was next taken up and all bids filed were opened; there being two joint bids, those of the Dolores Star-Cortez Sentinel and the Cortez Journal-Herald and Mancos Times-Tribune, each for the printing of legal notices, and two bids, those of the Cortez Sentinel-Dolores Star and Mancos Times-Tribune for the printing of county stationery. After due consideration it was moved, ^{by Commissioner Porter} to award the printing of legal notices to the Dolores Star-Cortez Sentinel upon their joint bid, designating the Dolores Star as the official paper of the County, and to award the printing of county stationery to the Mancos Times-Tribune. Seconded by Commissioner Englehart and carried.

It was moved by Mr. Porter that the Out West Printing and Stationery Company of Colorado Springs be given the bid for furnishing the County with record books, legal blanks and office supplies for the following year. Seconded and carried.

The Board of County Commissioners of Montezuma County met in adjourned session Tuesday, January 5th, 1932, at 10 o'clock A. M.

There were present: S. C. Englehart, Chairman; George W. Menefee, Commissioner; E. S. Porter, Commissioners, John J. Downey, Attorney and Mabel C. Waldron, Clerk.

It was moved by Mr. Porter that Mr. J. J. Downey be re-appointed County Attorney for the ensuing year. Seconded by Mr. Menefee and carried.

Moved by Mr. Porter that Frederick T. Henry be reappointed Deputy District Attorney. Seconded by Mr. Menefee and carried.

Moved by Mr. Porter that Dr. E. E. Johnson be reappointed County Physician. Seconded by Mr. Menefee and carried.

Mr. James Trimble appeared before the Board asking poor relief for Mr. and Mrs. Dug Forbes of Dolores. The Board agreed to pay Mr. Trimble rent in the amount of \$12.00 per month until such time as Blind Benefit is allowed Mrs. Forbes by the State.

Mrs. Mary Harbin appeared before the Board, asking for poor relief. She was given an order for \$10.00 per month for two or three months, temporary relief.

In the matter of the levies for the year 1931, it appearing to the Board that, in order to meet the expenses and liabilities of the County for the ensuing fiscal year it will be necessary to make application to the Colorado Tax Commission for permission to increase the levies for certain of the County funds beyond the limit otherwise authorized in that behalf, and that the levies in the amounts hereinafter stated will be required in that behalf, it is ordered by the Board that application be made accordingly to the Colorado Tax Commission as follows, signed by the Chairman of the Board and attested by the County Clerk with the County Seal:

To the Colorado Tax Commission:

The Board of County Commissioners of Montezuma County, represent and show as follows:

The assessed valuation of the county for the year 1930 was \$6,221,605, upon which was levied 18.63 mills, producing \$115,908.50.

The assessed valuation of the county for the year 1931 is \$5,192,375., upon which it is proposed to levy 19.63 mills, producing \$101,924.36. The levy last year and the proposed levy are set forth below:

Minutes of the meeting of July 5th were read, and upon motion duly made and seconded, same were approved as read.

Mr. F. L. Miller, Sec'y of the Montezuma County Chamber of Commerce appeared before the Board and asked that a monthly allowance be made in favor of the Chamber, same to be used for advertising purposes. Matter laid on the table.

The following order was passed: It having come to the attention of the Board of County Commissioners that the County now holds Tax Sale Certificates Nos. 8394 and 8395, described as follows:
