WHEREAS, Harry Morgan of Dolores, Montezuma County, Colorado, is well qualified to accept said position and perform the duties incident to such office;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it Resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Montezuma County, Colorado, in regular session assembled this 12th day of January, 1943, that this Board favors the appointment of Harry Morgan of Dolores, Montezuma County, Colorado, as a member of the Fish & Game Commission of the State of Colorado, and recommends to the Honorable John C. Vivian, Governor of the State of Colorado, that Harry Morgan be so appointed, and it is further resolved that a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to the Honorable John C. Vivian, Governor of the State of Colorado.

## RESOLUTION No. 2 (Walker, Kelly, McCabe)

WHEREAS the Treasurer of Montezuma County, Colorado, has in his hand and control certain moneys, and will from time to time receive additional funds from collection of taxes, as well as other sources; and

WHEREAS Be it Resolved by the Board of Commissioners of Montezuma County, Colorado, that the Citizens State Bank, of Cortez, Colorado, and the J. J. RESOLUTION No. 3 (Walker, Kelly, McCabe)

It is Hereby Resolved by the Board of Commissioners of Montezuma County, Colorado, in regular session assembled this 12th day of January, 1943, pursuant to the provisions of the Laws of the State of Colorado, Session Laws of 1941, Page 363 Par. 1, That the Treasurer of Montezuma County be, and he is hereby authorized, empowered, requested and directed to invest any part of available money in any County Fund, in Warrants of Montezuma County. The total amount to be invested in said warrants shall not exceed \$10,000.00, unless authorized by this Board. This Order effective January 12, 1943.

RESOLUTION No. 4 (Walker, Kelly, McCabe)

It is Hereby Resolved that pursuant to the provisions of Par. 38, Chap. 40, Vol. 2, 1935 Colorado Statutes annotated, S. G. Walker, of Montezuma County, Colorado, be, and he is hereby nominated, constituted and appointed Commissioner to execute deeds to real estate and convey any real estate belonging to Montezuma County, Colorado, upon such terms, price and conditions as the Board of County Commissioners of Montezuma County, Colorado, shall from time to time direct; and the said S. G. Walker, as Commissioner, is hereby authorized, directed and empowered to affix to any conveyances executed in accordance with the order, the seal of Montezuma County, Colorado; and it is further resolved that all other powers heretofore conferred upon any person other than S. G. Walker, be and the same are hereby revoked and cancelled.

RESOLUTION No. 5 (Walker, Kelly, McCabe)

Be it Resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Montezuma County, Colorado, in regular session assembled, that Harry V. Pyle, of Dolores, Montezuma County, Colorado, be, and he is hereby constituted and appointed Director for the Southwestern Water Conservation District in accordance with the terms and provisions of enactment of General Assembly of State of Colorado approved April 19, 1941. 



Dear Harry:

We confirm wire to you this afternoon as follows:

House Bill No. 106, re District Attorneys, is objectionable, and we request that this bill either be defeated or modified in order to equitably treat Montezuma County in connection with expenses in our district. Letter follows.

We find this bill objectionable for the following reasons:

1. Montezuma County in the past has paid 32% of the salary of the ASSISTANT DISTRICT ATTORNEY for the 6th judicial district, this ASSISTANT for this district has maintained his office in Durango and has always done the work that a deputy would normally do in LaPlata County and LaPlata County has not had a deputy, HENCE OUR COUNTY HAS PAID IN ADDITION TO THE 32% of the Assistant's salary \$900 per year for a deputy. In addition when we have occasion to have the District Attorney come to our County, we pay him mileage and other expenses. LaPlata County has no such expense to pay.
2. Also, we pay 32% of all office expense of the DA for his office at Durango, ie 32% of stenographer, rent, lights, telephone and what not.
3. The proposes bill would still leave us pay 32% of the Assistant's salary and we would share a deputy with some other County at a salary beyond our control.
