RESOLUTION No. 1-44 (McCabe, Walker, Kelly)

WHEREAS the Treasurer of Montezuma County, Colorado, has in his hand and control certain moneys, and will from time to time receive additional funds from collection of taxes, as well as other sources; and

WHEREAS Be it Resolved by the Board of Commissioners of Montezuma County, Colorado, that the Citizens State Bank, of Cortez, Colorado, and the J. J. Harris & Company, Bankers, of Dolores, Colorado, be, and they are hereby named, designated, constituted and appointed as depository banks for all funds and moneys of whatsoever kind that shall come into the possession of Claude H. Wilson by virtue of his office as County Treasurer of Montezuma County, Colorado, and said banks, and each of them herein named, are approved as depository banks. Clerk instructed to give a certified copy to the following: Claude H. Wilson, County Treasurer; Citizens State Bank, Cortez, and J. J. Harris & Company, Bankers, Dolores.

RESOLUTION No. 2-44 (McCabe, Walker, Kelly)

It is Hereby Resolved by the Board of Commissioners of Montezuma County, Colorado, in regular session assembled this 12th day of January, 1943, pursuant to the provisions of the Laws of the State of Colorado, Session Laws of 1941, Page 363 Par. 1, That the Treasurer of Montezuma County be, and he is hereby authorized, empowered, requested and directed to invest any part of available money in any County Fund, in Warrants of Montezuma County. The total amount to be invested in said warrants shall not exceed \$10,000.00, unless authorized by this Board. This Order effective January 7, 1944.

RESOLUTION No. 3-44 (McCabe, Walker, Kelly)

It is Hereby Resolved that pursuant to the provisions of Par. 38, Chap. 40, Vol. 2, 1935 Colorado Statutes annotated, the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners of Montezuma County, Colorado, be, and he is hereby nominated, constituted and appointed Commissioner to execute deeds to real estate and convey any real estate belonging to Montezuma County, Colorado, upon such terms, price and conditions as the Board of County Commissioners of Montezuma County, Colorado, shall from time to time direct; and the said Chairman, as Commissioner, is hereby authorized, directed and empowered to affix to any conveyances executed in accordance with the order, the seal of Montezuma County, Colorado; and it is further resolved that all other powers heretofore conferred upon any person other than the Chairman, be and the same are hereby revoked and cancelled.

RESOLUTION No. 4-44 (McCabe, Walker, Kelly)

It is Hereby Resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Montezuma County, Colorado, in adjourned session assembled, that Forest Service Funds to Montezuma County be apportioned 40% to School Funds and 60% to County Road Fund.

RESOLUTION No. 5-44 (McCabe, Walker, Kelly)

WHEREAS a new plate for the check signer has been ordered, but will not arrive for the Welfare Meeting of the Board;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it Resolved by the Board of Commissioners of Montezuma County, Colorado, that the plate with the names of S. C. Walker, Chairman, and Henry Thorpe, Clerk, be used until arrival of the new plate, and it is further resolved that a copy of this resolution be delivered to the County Treasurer.

RESOLUTION No. 6-44 (McCabe, Walker, Kelly)

It is Hereby Resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Montezuma County, Colorado, in regular session assembled this 7th day of January, 1944, that in all sales of real estate, and leases by the County, that the following expenses shall be paid to the O. C. R. fund prior to distribution for payment of taxes, as provided by Section 211, Chap. 142, 1935 CSA as amended.

1. Sale of real estate: 10% of amount received, and abstract charges (if any).
2. Leases: 15% of amount received and insurance and water charges (if any).

And It is Further Resolved that funds so accrued to the O. C. R. fund be used to defray expenses of assessor and other county officials in connection with said leases and sales, which expenses are payable out of said fund. All other orders heretofore entered are hereby so modified.

RESOLUTION No. 7-44 (McCabe, Walker, Kelly)

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY the Board of County Commissioners of Montezuma County in adjourned session assembled this 7th day of January, 1944, that Claude H. Wilson, the duly elected, qualified, and appointed Treasurer of Montezuma County, Colorado, be, and he is hereby authorized, empowered, directed and instructed to take deeds on all lands in Montezuma County on which the county holds tax sale certificates and on which the taxes are unpaid for five years or more, on those Certificates, pursuant to the provisions of the law in such case made and provided.

RESOLUTION No. 8-44 (McCabe, Walker, Kelly)

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Montezuma County, Colorado, in adjourned session assembled this 7th day of January, 1944, that the following policy be, and the same is hereby adopted and approved in the matter of sale of Tax Certificates held by Montezuma County.

Sale of certificate shall not be permitted to any person, firm, association or corporation on land when such person, firm, association or corporation has any record interest therein, either as record owner, mortgagee or other claimant.

Offers, when accepted by this Board, shall be the warrant and authority of the County Treasurer of Montezuma County, Colorado, to accept as low as the sum so offered, plus Treasurer's fees, and if sale be not completed within thirty days from the date of authorization by the Board of County Commissioners, the order authorizing such sale shall be of no further force and effect.

AND IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that true and accurate orders of such transactions be kept and maintained in the office of this Board.

RESOLUTION No. 9-44 (McCabe, Walker, Kelly)

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Montezuma County, Colorado, in adjourned session assembled this 7th day of January, 1944, that the following policy be, and the same is hereby adopted in the matter of sale of real estate owned by Montezuma County, to-wit:

That all offers for the purchase of land owned by Montezuma County and subject to sale shall be made to the Board of County Commissioners, and if accepted by said Board, payment must be made within thirty days.

Upon all sales of real estate by Montezuma County, unless otherwise provided by proper order, Montezuma County shall reserve all oil, gas and mineral rights, together with the right of ingress and egress to remove the same, and Montezuma County shall reserve rights-of-way for roads as now constructed, or which may hereafter be constructed; and

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that all sales of real estate shall be made subject to taxes for current year, which taxes shall be paid by the buyer of said real estate.

And offer which has been accepted and upon which payment shall not have been received within thirty days, shall be of no further force and effect.

Deed, when executed, shall be executed by a Commissioner and shall make the reservations hereinabove mentioned.

AND IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that no sale of land shall be made unless the price thereof shall exceed one-third of the assessed value, and shall otherwise conform with the provisions of the laws of the State of Colorado pertaining to the sale of real estate by a County.

RESOLUTION No. 10-44 (McCabe, Walker, Kelly)

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Montezuma County, Colorado, in adjourned session assembled this 7th day of January, 1944, that Ralph L. McKee, Registered Accountant, of Boulder, Colorado, is hereby appointed to audit the financial records of Montezuma County semi-annually at and for an annual remuneration of \$400.00, payable in two installments of \$200.00 each, payment to be made following delivery of report of semi-annual audit.

RESOLUTION No. 11-44 (McCabe, Walker, Kelly)

WHEREAS lot 12, block 2, Riverside Addition to the Town of Dolores, Colorado, has not appeared upon the assessment rolls of Montezuma County, nor has said property been assessed or taxes for any year since 19 .

AND, WHEREAS, it appears that said lot has not been assessed for the reason that the same has been part of the river channel of the Dolores River, and said channel has again changed; and

WHEREAS it is expedient and to the best interests of Montezuma County that said land be placed upon the assessment rolls and that between the years 19 and 1942 said land was without value;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it Resolved that all general taxes against said lot 12, block 2, Riverside Addition to the Town of Dolores for all years up to and including the year 1942, whether assessed or not, be and the same are hereby declared uncollectable and discharged of record.

RESOLUTION No. 12-44 (McCabe, Walker, Kelly)

Re: Living quarters.

Gentlemen:

Please be advised that the living quarters heretofore designated by your Board for the use of the Sheriff's office, are not in the opinion of the undersigned Sheriff, adequate or satisfactory, nor has there been any effort made to make them satisfactory or adequate, in so far as the amount of space, sanitary and plumbing facilities, cooking and sleeping facilities are concerned.

I am as anxious to have this matter settled as I believe the Board of Commissioners is. My requirements are not elaborate. I believe that adequate accommodations would consist of at least 3 rooms of reasonable size, a toilet and bath or shower, cooking and sanitary facilities such as a sink and stove. Provision should of course be made for communication between such quarters and the jail by buzzer system or other similar means for use at night.

If furnished adequate quarters, I would naturally expect to pay for the heat and light used therein myself, and not at County expense.

I must know, for my own protection as Sheriff, whether or not the Board can and will furnish adequate facilities, including a minimum of accommodations as above outlined. I do not mean to be arbitrary or unreasonable, but since this matter has been pending with the board in one way or another for nearly two years, I believe, I feel that some definite decision should in fairness to you gentlemen and myself, be made at once.

Will you kindly consider my requirements, and either accept or reject them at your meeting of the 17th, and notify me accordingly. If I am not informed by the 18th of definite action one way or the other, I shall assume that my request has been rejected, and will thereafter govern myself and my office accordingly. I sincerely hope we can, at the meeting of the 17th of November, next discuss this matter to a satisfactory conclusion, whereby suitable quarters can and will be provided, for I believe the law entitles this office to that consideration.
