- 1. That at the data of this resolution and certification the present commissioner districts are not as nearly equal in population as possible.
- That the commissioners districts as heretofore established have remained unchanged for a period of more than two years.
- That it is expedient and proper and to the interests of Monteguma County, Colorado, its residents and inhabitants, that the commissioners districts be altered and re-established.

Commissioner Porter thereupon moved the adoption of the foregoing resolution. Commissioner Talker thereupon seconded the motion and upon roll call the vote, upon motion for the adoption of said resolution resulted as follows: Those voting Aye: Commissioner Porter; Commissioner Malker. Those voting Nay: Commissioner Kelly. Thereupon the Chairman declared said resolution duly adopted and instruct ed the Clerk to spread said resolution and certificate of determination upon the records of the Dourd.

DISTRICT NO. 2 shall consist of that certain area in Montezuma County, Colorado, beginning at the point of intersection of Range line between Ranges 14 and 15 beginning at the point of intersection of Range line between Ranges 14 and 15 West of the New Mexico Principal Meridian and the minth correction line (said ninth correction line being the North line of Township 36 North, Ranges 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, and 20 West of the New Mexico Principal Meridian) thence South along said Range line to the Southeast corner of Section 36, Township 35 North, Range 15 West of the New Mexico Principal Meridian, thence due South to the South line of Montezuma County, thence West along South line of Montezuma County to the Southwest corner of Montezuma County; thence North along West line of Montezuma County to the point of intersection of the ninth correction line and the West line of Montezuma County, thence East along said ninth correction line to point line of Montezuma County, thence East along said minth correction line to point of beginning.

DISTRICT NO. 3 shall consist of all that certain area in Monteguma County, Colorado, lying East of line described as beginning at a point on the North line of Montezuma County, Colorado, which point is the Northwest corner of Section 21, Township 39 North, Range 15 West of the New Mexico Principal Meridian, thence South to the Northwest corner of Section 21, Township 37 North, Range 15 West of the New Mexico Principal Meridian, thence East to the Northeast corner of said Section 21, Township 37 North, Range 15 West of the New Mexico Principal Meridian, thence South to the Southeast corner of said Section 21, thence East to the Northeast corner of Section 27, Township 37 North, Range 15 West of the New Maxico

IMPREAS because of the increase in the cost of supplies during the past year attributed to the inflation cycle which has affected all businesses and departments of County Government, which could not have been foreseen at the time of adopting the budget for 1947; and

WHEREAS, There has been a substantial increase in accidental feaths on highways of Montezuma County reflecting an increase in Sheriff's mileage and expense, an increase in Coroner's fees, juries and expenses and an increase in Justices of the Peace fees, which could not have been foreseen at the time of adopting the 1947 budget; and

WHEREAS. It has been necessary to replace worn and obsolete equipment, as new equipment was available; and

WHEREAS, On account of a substantial increase in recording necessitating the purchase of additional binders and supplies, which could not have been foreseen at the time of adopting the 1947 budget; and

WHERE, Tax delinquencies showed a substantial increase, resulting in more than doubling the cost of publishing the Delinquent Tax List furing 1947;

WHEREAS The Weed Control Committee of The County Planning Board, approved a full time clerk at an increase in salary in the office of the County Agent and an allowance to cover activities of the County Agent other than covered by the budget, all of which was covered by the Meed Control program and when determined to be paid the OCR fund, which action could not have been a start of adopting the 1947 budget; and foreseen at the time of adopting the 1947 budget; and

WHEREAS, There has been an increase in costs of all road material, parts, and supplies and much new equipment available for replacement, which could not have been foreseen at the time of adopting the 1947 budget; and

WHEREAS, an increase in business of The Johnson Hospital Division of Montezuma County, resulted in increased costs, which could not have been foreseen at the time of adopting the 1947 budget; and

WHEREAS, the Colorado State Supervisor of The Rodent Control program in Montezuma County, authorized the use of county employed personnel for work on The Unite' States Forest on a reimbursable basis, which could not have been foreseen at the time of adopting the 1947 budget; and
