

The Board of County Commissioners of Montezuma County, Colorado met in special reorganization session Tuesday, Jenuary 9, 1951, at 8:30 A.M.

Nominations for Chairman for the year 1951 were called for. Commissioner Porter nominated J. C. Rumburg. Commissioner Clampitt seconded the nomination. Question: Commissioner Porter voted aye; Commissioner Clampitt voted aye; Commissioner Rumburg refrained. Commissioner Rumburg as Chairman announced the election of J. G. Rumburg as Chairman of the Board of Commissioners for the year 1951.

James B. Garrison, as County Attorney at a salary of \$75.00 per month for the year of 1951.

Harry W. Curtis, as Custodianof the Court House at a salary of \$160.00 per month.

Jack Allum, Shop Foreman at a salary of \$264.20 per month.

Dick Elliott, Foreman Road District Number 1, at a salary of \$232.20 per month.

Robert . Page, Foreman Road District Number 2, at a salary of \$232.20 per month.

Lawson Bowling, Foreman Road District Number 3, at a salary of \$232.20 per month.

Otis W. Baysinger, Foreman Crusher, at a salary of \$232.20 per month.

RESOLUTION

Thereas, the Board of Commissioners finds that the public interests will best be served by certain changes in designation of State Highways lying in the County of Monterums, now, be it resolved, that the designation of Highway No. 184—7.2 miles from Arriola to Dolores, and Highway No. 146—8.1 miles McMlmc Canyon, west from Highway No. 666—a total of 15.3 miles of highway now designated as State Secondary Highway—will be transferred to the Navajo Trails Extension beginning at a point on Highway No. 666 and extending to the Four Corners, provided the Navajo Trails Extension is approved for construction. Be it further resolved that this transfer will be made because the Board of Commissioners finds the Navajo Trails Extension is more assential to the best interest of the people of Monteruma County than are the above enumerated highways.

Tax Certificate No. 12560 cancelled by reason of double assessment for two years. County Treasurer is hereby ordered to cancel said certificate and refund the taxes and interest.
