EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT RESOLUTION MONTEZUMA COUNTY, COLORADO

1. PURPOSES

The purposes of the Emergency Management Resolution of Montezuma County (hereinafter referred to as "the Resolution") are to provide for the basic government functions of maintaining the public peace, health and safety during an emergency or disaster, including mitigation, preparedness, response and recovery. It is the purpose and intent of the Resolution to bring Montezuma County, Colorado, into full compliance with appropriate sections of the Colorado Disaster Emergency Act of 1973, part 1 of article 2 of title 24, C.R.S. 1973, as amended.

2. **DEFINITIONS**

The following definitions shall apply to terms used in the Resolution:

- A. "Disaster" means an occurrence or imminent threat of widespread or severe damage, injury, or loss of life or property resulting from any natural or man-made cause, including, but not limited to, fire, plague, spill, or any water contamination requiring emergency action to avert danger or damage, epidemic, air contamination, blight, drought, infestation, explosion, civil disturbance or hostile military or para-military action.
- B. "Emergency" means any occurrence or imminent threat of widespread or severe damage, injury, or loss of life or property resulting from a natural or man-made cause that is less severe than a disaster, but of such severity that it cannot be handled by the regular employees of Montezuma County acting prudently within the scope of their employment.
- C. "Emergency Management" means the marshaling of all necessary resources available to meet all potential disasters or emergencies under coordinated management. The phases of emergency management are mitigation, preparedness, response and recovery.
- D. "Mitigation" means any activities that actually eliminate or reduce the probability of occurrence of disaster.
- E. "Preparedness" means the development of plans, the stockpiling and inventory of critical resources, the organization and training of response personnel, and the exercise of plans.

F. "Recovery" means those actions, both short-term and long-term, that result in the planned redevelopment of Montezuma County after a disaster consistent with disaster experience and with measures available for hazard reduction.

3. ORGANIZATION

The Emergency Management Program for Montezuma County shall be organized as follows:

- A. The Board of County Commissioners of Montezuma County hereby creates an organization for emergency management which shall be known as the Montezuma County Office of Emergency Management (hereinafter referred to as "OEM"). OEM shall have such professional, technical, secretarial and clerical employees as are deemed necessary by the Board of County Commissioners for the proper functioning of the organization.
- B. The Board of County Commissioners shall appoint a Director of Emergency Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Director") who shall be the executive head of OEM. The Director will be responsible to the Board of County Commissioners for the administration, organization and operations of OEM.
- C. The Director shall designate and appoint deputy directors to assume the emergency duties of the Director in the event of his absence or inability to act.

4. DUTIES AND POWERS OF THE DIRECTOR

The Director is hereby empowered to:

- A. Prepare and keep current a plan to be known as the Montezuma County Disaster and Emergency Plan. The Plan will conform to the standards and requirements for such plans as promulgated by the Division of Disaster Emergency Services of the State of Colorado.
- B. To prepare and present to the Board of County Commissioners for approval a plan to be known as the Disaster and Emergency Plan, and to prepare and present to the Board of County Commissioners for approval updates to the plan.
- C. Represent OEM in all dealings with public or private agencies pertaining to emergency management and disasters.
- D. Prepare an annual budget for OEM and submit such budget to the Board of County Commissioners for consideration.
- E. Receive on behalf of Montezuma County from any duly constituted governmental agency or any approved private

person or agency, any services, equipment, supplies, materials or funds, by way of gift, grant or loan, for emergency or disaster purposes.

- F. Negotiate on behalf of Montezuma County with other duly constituted governmental agencies for the establishment of such mutual aid agreements as may be deemed necessary by the Board of County Commissioners and such other governmental agencies. The scope of such mutual aid agreements may encompass all facets of the Emergency Management and Disaster Plan, and may pledge the assistance and cooperation of Montezuma County to all emergency and disaster situations in return for similar pledges from such other governmental agencies.
- G. In the event of a declared disaster or emergency, act under the direction of the Board of County Commissioners, or its designated representative Commissioner, in the interests of mitigation and recovery from such disaster or emergency.

5. DUTIES AND POWERS OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

The duties and powers of the Board of County Commissioners shall be as follows:

- A. It shall be the duty of the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners to declare that a disaster or emergency exists within Montezuma County. Such declaration shall continue for a period not to exceed seven (7) days. Such declaration may be continued or renewed for a period in excess of seven (7) days with the consent of a majority of the members of the Board of County Commissioners.
- B. Any order or proclamation declaring, continuing or terminating a disaster or emergency shall be filed promptly with the Division of Disaster Emergency Services of the State of Colorado, and with the Clerk and Recorder of Montezuma County. Such order or proclamation shall be promptly distributed to the appropriate representatives of the news media.
- C. The Board of County Commissioners may delegate the duties and powers as they deem appropriate to any member of the Board of County Commissioners or to the Director.

6. DECLARATION OF DISASTER OR EMERGENCY

The effect of a declaration of an emergency or a disaster shall be to activate the response and recovery aspects of all applicable disaster or emergency plans. Such a declaration shall also authorize the furnishings of all aid and assistance provided for under such plans.

A RESOLUTION DECLARING IT TO BE UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON TO OWN, KEEP, HARBOR OR POSSESS A VICIOUS DOG THAT IS NOT UNDER CONTROL AND PROVIDING CRIMINAL PENALTIES AND ALSO PROVIDING FOR IMPOUND-MENT OF SUCH DOGS.

WHEREAS the Board of County Commissioners of Montezuma County, State of Colorado, finds that vicious dogs not under control present a clear and present danger to the safety of persons and property and that persons and property must be protected from such dogs;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Montezuma County pursuant to 30-15-101 and 102, C.R.S., except as provided in 30-15-101(1)(b), C.R.S., that:

- It shall be unlawful for any person to own, keep, harbor or possess a vicious dog that is not under control.
- "Vicious dog" means a dog that is a clear and present danger to the safety of persons or property.
- "Control" means (a) that the dog is physically restrained to the premises of its custodian, or (b) the presence of the custodian of said dog enforcing the dog's obedience to said custodian's commands.
- "Custodian" means any person owning, keeping, harboring or 4. possessing a dog.
- "Premises" means the custodian's real property or vehicle.
- (a) Any violation hereof not involving bodily injury to any person shall be a class 2 petty offense, and punishable, upon conviction, by a fine of not more than three hundred (\$300.00) dollars or by imprisonment in the county jail for not more than ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment for each separate offense. The penalty assessment procedure provided in section 16-2-201, C.R.S., may be followed for violations not involving bodily injury to any person as follows: the penalty assessment fine schedule shall be twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars for the first violation, fifty (\$50.00) dollars for the second violation by the same person, and one hundred (\$100.00) dollars for the third violation by the same person.

- (b) Any offense involving bodily injury to any person by a dog shall be a class 2 misdemeanor and punishable upon conviction as provided in 18-1-106, C.R.S., for each separate offense.
- 7. The Sheriff of Montezuma County, Colorado, and his deputies shall enforce this resolution by impounding a vicious dog not under control, and further, whenever said officer has probable cause to believe that a violation of section 6(b) hereof has been committed or has personal knowledge of any other violation hereof, he may issue a citation or summons and complaint to the violator stating the nature of the violation with sufficient particularity to give notice of said charge to the violator.
- 8. All proceedings hereunder shall be commenced by Summons and Complaint filed in the County Court in and for Montezuma County, Colorado. The District Attorney shall be the prosecuting attorney. All fines, forfeitures and other moneys collected shall be paid to the Montezuma County Treasurer at once.
- 9. This resolution is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety from vicious dogs not under control.
- 10. This resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption.
