- August 25, 2023 President Biden approved Colorado's disaster declaration request and it is formally known as <u>DR4731</u>.



EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG):

- 2023 Grant was officially awarded 9/14/23 for \$25,656.
- 2023 grant 1st Qtr. was submitted 4/15/23, waiting for payment.
- 2023 grant 2nd Qtr. was submitted 7/17/23, waiting for payment.
- 2023 grant 3rd Qtr. was submitted 10/10/23, waiting for payment.

Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP):

- County generators grant project was submitted and approved by the State in December, 2022 for the 4 remaining generators requested for County buildings. Coroners Building, Annex 1, Annex 3, and the Fairgrounds. Grant will pay 90% of the cost. Grant request \$170,486.40 was submitted Dec 2022. County 10% capital cost is \$17,048.64 for three-year project. FEMA corresponded on 7/13/23 with questions and we responded. Awaiting final FEMA approval award. Because of federal funding cuts within FEMA, we are on a holding pattern for this funding until further notice.
- The County will update the Hazard Mitigation Plan beginning in June of 2024 with a completion date of December 2025. This occurs every 5 years. The Grant Notice of Intent (NOI) was submitted for \$50,000.

Local Emergency Planning Committee (From LEPC Chair):

Memo of Understanding (MOU):

 Omnibus agreement (MOU) for County and Municipalities is under review by attorney and Administrator to present to the BOCC.

Public Information Coordinator (PIO):

 Working to promote the new Everbridge Emergency Alert System through press releases, media interviews, flyers, and personal demonstrations, as well as normal, daily duties.

Southwest All Hazards Advisory Council (SWAHAC):

• Most of the projects had approval from the State on the 2023-2024 Grant. Some needed more detail justification to be re-submitted. A final list of projects and amounts will be developed in the coming months.

Training and Exercise Plan (TEP) and Intergraded Preparedness Plan (IPP):

• New 3-year plans for 2024-2026 for the County have been submitted to the state and approved.

Training/Drills:

- October 24th the EM attended FEMA MGT 417 Crisis Management Course for 8 hours.
- October 25th and 26th the EM instructed an Active Shooter Class for 13 students.
- November 1st the EM held an ICS 100/700/800 8-hour class for 13 County employees.
- November 6th and 7th the EM held an ICS 100/200/700/800 16-hour class for 7 students.
- November 8th the Tactical Interoperability Plan Exercise was performed in the SW Region. Montezuma County participated with 23 agencies along with the EOC Staff.
- November 11th an aircraft simulated crash exercise was performed in the Pleasant View area with 15 responders.
- November 14th 16th the ICS 300 24-hour class was held for the SW Region at the Southern Ute Indian Tribe. 20 students attended.
- November 29th the EM will hold a 4-hour Unified command class for the SW Region.
