A successful and fun County Fair

Summer sure goes by quickly when it's full of programming! We've been busy making sure 4-H members are ready for fair and ensuring our community has tools for a successful growing season.

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In the past few months, the 4-H Program was busy preparing for County Fair along with State Fair. We had 46 projects go to State Fair with four of those projects receiving Reserve Grand Champion. Along with fair preparations, we also had two programs in July. We had the first junior district camp for members between the ages of 8-10 with 13 members from Montezuma County attend. In July we hosted the Southwest Colorado Ag Tour for 4-H youth that our intern Willa helped develop. We toured Los Miramontes Lavender Farm, Diamond D Processing, and Yellow Jacket Livestock Auction. A huge thank you to our excellent summer intern Willa Rice for all the work she did for us this summer.

Agriculture

Ag site visits this summer have served new landowners and seasoned farmers. From pest issues, weed control and grazing management partnering with the Moncos/High Desert Conservation District has led to many collaborative workshops. We held an Ag irrigation management workshop this summer which wraps up the \$26,600 grant from LOR for irrigation programming. Thank you to the LOR Foundation for making this great programming possible.

Our horticulture program hosted weekly Master Gardener Help Desk and a monthly Master Gardener booth at the Cortez Farmers Market. One of our newest and most energetic Master Gardeners Connie Clementson has a new project with the Cortez Library which is launched in August. The orchard was hit by a late spring frost so there will be limited apples available this fall but we continue to partner with Dolores County Extension to make sure the orchard looks it's best for the you pick in September.

Celebrating the close of a strong year

Another year down, many more to go! We finished up the 2024 year with our Annual Achievement Night where members were celebrated for their achievements in 4-H. We recognized our Outstanding Members in 4-H (Tatum Otteson, Eli Jarmon, and Tanna Young), as well as our Friends of 4-H (The LOR Foundation and Logan Hindmarsh), and Outstanding Leader (Sabrina Elliott). With the close of 2024, we are also looking to the future of 2025 with enrollment opening. We learned much from this year, but are excited for next year!

Agriculture

This fall we concluded a CSU Extension Intern project in collaborations with Downtown Colorado Inc., CSU's Rural Economic Development Institute and economic development directors from Ute Mountain Ute Tribe, Town of Mancos and City of Cortez. At the close of the internship we gathered to learn about the actionable steps we can take to support agritourism in our community. Stay tuned for another great agritourism and economic feasibility CSU Extension Internship in 2025.

One of the largest project accomplishments this year was the award of a USDA-NIFA grant that Emily is a team member on. This grant will support multiple projects including support for the CSU Drought Advisor Program and rangeland monitoring staff for the Ute Mountain Ute Tribe. Emily was also awarded a \$28,800 grant through the LOR foundation to support the work of 2 graduate students to analyze rangeland data, collect land manager narratives and to host an educational rangeland workshop in fall of 2025. We hope to interpret the regenerative grazing practices in relation to soil health and water holding capacity while capturing the history of the land.

Horticulture

We're celebrating the impact our Colorado Master Gardeners (CMGs) had this year logging over 672 volunteer hours and over 237 continuing education hours in 2025. We're excited to have a new apprentice for the CMG program and one CMG is retaking the Green School training. Master Gardeners in Montezuma County work many hours at the Mesa Verde visitor center and the Canyon of the Ancients Visitor Center. A new project led by Connie Clementson at the library is going strong with a great day planting beds and the coordinator of ongoing maintenance. We hope this provides beautiful garden beds for the library and also provides an educational opportunity for the community on what plants grow well in our area.

We're looking forward to continuing the great work of Master Gardeners in our community in the new year!










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
