RECYCLING

At this time, the landfill purchases old corrugate cardboard, old mixed paper, and plastics numbers 1 and 2 for recycling. The landfill also collects scrap metal for our local salvage yards. The landfill purchasing price of recyclable commodities is the fair market value of the commodity less the landfill's cost to process them. Because the markets fluctuate monthly please call the office in advance to check the current month's prices.

Beginning July 1, 2019

The landfill will charge an additional 30% for customers (both commercial haulers and private individuals) who do not source separate their recyclables.

The landfill is asking that at a minimum customers sort the following commodities: Cardboard Office Paper #1 Plastics Aluminum Tin
