EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

Colorado Emergency Preparedness Assessment (CEPA)

• The 2022 CEPA was completed and is required to be updated every 3 years. The CEPA for 2025 is completed. Final draft is out to stakeholders for review.

Community Animal Response Team (CART)

 Continue planning and meetings for the CART for Dolores/Montezuma Counties. Draft procedure completed. Monthly meetings and training are being scheduled. May 15th CART training at EOC was performed. Procedures, IDs, Waivers and Background checks.

Community Emergency Response Team (CERT)

- Members are attending various training/exercises in Dolores/Montezuma County.
- May 8th CERT training was held on wilderness search and rescue at Bradfield Campground.

Continuity of Operations Plan (COOP).

• COOP for the Annex 1 final draft is out for stakeholder review and final signatures. COOP for the Coroner's office is in progress.

Communications

- The inspection of the Dolores Tower site was on 5/10/24 for infrastructure upgrades. Documents submitted to USDA-FS are approved. Homeland Security Grant approval obtained. Moving forward with the project in the Summer if DHS funding is available.
- The county planning project to reprogram all 800MHz radios in Montezuma County, Dolores County and Ute Mountain Ute Tribe began 4/1/24. This project should be completed by June 30, 2025.

• Secure Rural Schools Program funding for \$43,636.49 was approved by the BOCC for Emergency Management Communication Equipment. We have ordered the equipment, and it should be delivered by late June.

Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG):

- 2025 EMPG Grant application was submitted for \$57,103. Waiting on Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) to come out from FEMA for the current grant in 2025.
- 1st Qtr. reimbursement was submitted for \$21,000.12.

Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP):

- County generators grant project approved.
 - Total Project Cost is \$170,486.40, with the FEMA Federal Share amount of \$154,249.60. The end date on the grant is 2/01/27.
 - Reimbursement requests for \$112,579.85 have been received.
 - > Reimbursements we submitted this year for \$45,829.82 under review.
 - > Project is 95% completed.
- The EM has begun the process to update the Hazard Mitigation Plan (HMP) for the County. This process occurs every 5 years. The Hazard Mitigation Grant Program funding was cancelled. We will be seeking other grant opportunities to continue the planning process.

Integrated Preparedness Plan (IPP)

- The 3-year plan for 2026-2028 for the County was finalized and submitted to the State.
- SW Incident Management Team IPP is also updated to 2025 2026 period and submitted to the State.

Local Emergency Planning Committee (From LEPC Chair):

- EHS facility tours will begin in a few months for the generation of this year's EAP.
- EHS facilities updated.
- Regional and Local Emergency Planning Committee meetings were held.

Public Information Officer (PIO):

- Continuing to assist the public in getting signed up for Everbridge Alert and Warnings.
- Assisted County Admin with administrative duties.
- Basic PIO training was held on May 20, 21, 22 at the Dolores Fire Protection District main station.

Southwest All Hazards Advisory Council (SWAHAC):

- EM has been approved for no-match grants. These grants do not pass through the County for financial support or approval. They are an outside fiscal agent.
- Status on the projects are:
 - > A Star Link mobile communication system and service on hold.
 - Antennas and radio base station for EOC on hold.
 - Communication Towers Infrastructure on hold.
 - Alternate EOC electronics on hold.
 - Radio re-programing in progress
 - CERT training and equipment on hold.
 - SW Regional Exercise on hold.

Training/Drills:

- EM attended training in Castle Rock for Radio Summit May 7,8, 2025
- EM held EOC Training on 5/14/25 on Debris Management
- EM attended TLO training on Fire Season on 5/21/25
- EM completed EMI FEMA training and received certificates on IS-10 Animals in Disasters, Awareness and Preparedness, IS-11 Animals in Disasters, Community Planning, and IS-111 Livestock in Disasters.
