Colorado Emergency Preparedness Assessment (CEPA)

• The CEPA for 2025 is completed.

Community Animal Response Team (CART)

• Monthly meetings and training are being held. On July 17th training was on basic animal shelter intakes.

Community Emergency Response Team (CERT)

 Monthly meetings and training are being held. July 10th training on Evacuations and Salamander.

Continuity of Operations Plan (COOP).

• Begin working on COOP for Maintenance Building.

Communications

- The inspection of the Dolores Tower site was on 5/10/24 for infrastructure upgrades. Documents submitted to USDA-FS are approved. Homeland Security Grant approval obtained. Moving forward with the project in the Summer if DHS funding is available.
- The county planning project to reprogram all 800MHz radios in Montezuma County, Dolores County and Ute Mountain Ute Tribe began 4/1/24. This project was completed in July.
- Secure Rural Schools Program funding for \$43,636.49 was approved by the BOCC for Emergency Management Communication Equipment. We have ordered the equipment, and it was delivered.

Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG):

- 2025 EMPG Grant application was submitted for \$57,103. Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO)came out for the grant in July.
- 1st Qtr. reimbursement was submitted for \$21,000.12.

2nd Qtr. reimbursement was submitted for \$25,064.08

Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP):

- County generators grant has 98% of the project completed. 3rd Qtr. work plan and reimbursements submitted. Completion estimated August 30th for close out.
- Hazard Mitigation Plan planning grant will be submitted mid-August to the National Disaster Mitigation Enterprise for funding.

Integrated Preparedness Plan (IPP)

• Completed.

Local Emergency Planning Committee (From LEPC Chair):

- EHS facility tour was conducted at the Messer Plant on G Road on June 17th.
 Other facilities will be scheduled in the next few months.
- Local Emergency Planning Committee meetings were held.

Public Information Officer (PIO):

- Continuing to assist the public in getting signed up for Everbridge Alert and Warnings.
- Assisted County Admin with administrative duties.
- Updating Web site

Southwest All Hazards Advisory Council (SWAHAC):

- EM has been approved for no-match grants. These grants do not pass through the County for financial support or approval. They are an outside fiscal agent.
